## Pastor's Greetings

The Peace of Christ Be with You All,

Greetings and Happy Advent, everyone! I hope this finds you with a stomach full of delicious Thanksgiving food and a heart filled with all the joys and blessings of the season. This will be a special Christmas for the church, as it will provide space once again for the in-person worship and holiday fellowship we all missed so dearly last year. This year, we have much more to offer, including:

- -11/28: 1st Sunday of Advent (10am)
- -12/2 and 12/5: Wassailing & Caroling in/around Richland
- -12/5: 2nd Sunday of Advent (10am) and Afternoon Prayer (4pm, before caroling)
- -12/12: 3rd Sunday of Advent & Children's Christmas Pageant (10am), Healing & Prayer service (4pm)
- -12/19: Christmas Sunday & Festival of Music! (10am)
- -12/24: Journey to Bethlehem (4:30), Christmas Coffee House (5:30), Candlelight Service (7pm)
- -12/26: Carols and Leftovers! (10am)

There is a very specific and important reason we so missed this activity last year, and that reason is *Incarnational Presence*. Incarnational Presence simply means that we believe God is present with us, here in the physical world, and we experience that presence more deeply and meaningfully when we are together in person.

Incarnation is the fourth of our themes for what has been a fruitful worship series on The Way of Jesus. It is little more or less than the continuous outpouring of God's loving presence into all of creation. *Incarnation is realized most profoundly in the person of Jesus*, whose birth we covet and celebrate during this season of anticipation, and whose anointing as the Christ Child we recognize from the beginning of time (John 1: 1-14).

When we recognize the Christ Child in the world, and when we accept this child as the reality of God's Love and Light, then we recognize that incarnational presence *in ourselves and in each other*. That is what it means to practice Peace on Earth and Good Will to all! That is what it means to know Comfort and Joy. Without the Christ Child in our lives and in our hearts, we too easily forget the miraculous mystery, reality, and wonder of Incarnation. Indeed, that is why Tiny Tim can so deeply proclaim "God Bless us, every one!" A Merry Christmas to you all, and we will see you in church.

#### Wassailing!!


